

# EXPLOSION

## 1. If there is an explosion inside university building:

- Immediately take cover under tables, desks or other solid objects.
- Call the police – **997 (or 112)**, informing about the event and notify Rector's Proxy for Security Affairs – **501 556 557**.
- After the effects of the explosion have subsided, evacuate the building, via the stairways. Do not use elevators.
- Stay away from damaged glass pieces and windows.
- Do not touch, handle or move any suspicious objects.
- If possible, assist lightly injured and persons with disabilities, however leaving the casualties and severely wounded.
- Once outside, move to an area away from the affected building – designated assembly point - at the car park in front of the university building.
- Keep roadways and walkways clear for emergency personnel and vehicles.
- Do not attempt to go back to the building.

## 2. If you are trapped in debris:

- Avoid unnecessary movement so that you do not kick up dust.
- Cover your nose and mouth with anything you have on hand.
- Tap on a pipe or wall so that rescuers can hear where you are.
- If possible use a mobile phone, a whistle or flashlight to signal rescuers.
- Shout only as a last resort, since it can cause a person to inhale dangerous amounts of dust.
